A Public hearing for the purpose of hearing public comment(s) pertaining to the application of the Troutdale Fire Department and Rescue Squad, Inc. (the "borrower"), Virginia nonprofit nonstock corporation (the "Borrower"), whose address is 291 Ripshin Rd, Troutdale, VA 24378, for a loan to be secured by the Borrower in a principal amount of up to \$300,000 bonds (the "Bonds") as part of a plan of finance to assist the Borrower in financing certain of the costs of (a) the acquisition and equipping of 1 new F550 Mini Pumper (demo) which will be located at the fire house of the Borrower. Approval by the County of Grayson shall not entail any financial obligation or indebtedness of the County. The propert to be acquired will be owned, operated and principally used by the Borrower for the benefit of the residents of Grayson County, by providing emergency fire protection and first-responder services and thereby promote the public good and general health, safety and welfare of the County. All or a portion of the indebtedness is expected to be issued as "qualified 501(c)(3) bonds" as defined in Section 145 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). The Borrower is exempt from the payment of federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

Supervisor Fant made the motion to approve the agenda/consent agenda; duly seconded by Supervisor Belton. Motion carried 5-0.

IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING(S)

For the purpose of hearing public comment pertaining to the adoption of an Ordinance making it unlawful for any person to violate federal law by using the mails or express companies for the mailing, carriage in the mails or delivery within Grayson County of any article or thing designed, adapted or intended for producing abortion or any substance, article instrument, drug, medicine or thing advertised or designed to lead another to apply it for use in abortion. The proposed ordinance is being considered with two alternative effective dates: the first alternative would enact the ordinance to be effective only in the event that the County of Grayson obtains a declaratory judgment from a court that it may enact and enforce an ordinance requiring compliance with the abortion-related provisions of 18 U.S.C.§1461 and 18 U.S.C. §1462, however those statutes are interpreted by the court, and the declaratory judgment becomes final upon the conclusion of direct appeals.

Mr. Boyer read portions of the proposed ordinance (which are on file in the County Administrator's office. Mr. Durbin, County Attorney, addressed the Board and noted that the difference between the two ordinances: one would become effective immediately and the other one includes a trigger clause meaning it would tak effect when Grayson County obtains a declaratory judgment from a court that it may enact and enforce an ordinance requiring compliance with the abortion-related provision of 18 U.S.C.§1461 and §1462. Supervisor Fant made the motion to open the public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Belton. Motion carried 5-0.

IN RE: PRESENTATIONS OR REQUESTS

James L. Werth, Jr., PH.D., ABPP – CEO Tri-Area Community Health – Tri-Area/Elk Creek Rescue Squad Collaboration – Mr. Werth presented a letter to the Board (listed below) along with an overview of Collaboration between Tri-Area Community Health/Elk Creek Rescue Squad. Mr. Werth will take another look at the possibility of a Whitetop Clinic; lots of activity going on at the Fries Clinic.

Dear Administrator Boyer,

On October 27, I met with Jamie Carpenter, Chief of the Elk Creek Rescue Squad (ECRS). We talked about possible ways to collaborate, and we developed a plan. Fortunately, the Virginia Department of Health's State Office of Rural Health had an Innovative Programming grant that was due the following week, so Jamie and I worked together to submit a proposal. I just learned that our request for \$20,000 for start-up equipment was funded.

The basic idea is for Tri-Area Community Health (TACH) to place a telehealth-only clinic in the ECRS building and, later this year, add a Community Paramedicine component that will allow us to assist people in their homes. We believe this plan will help residents of Grayson County with their medical and behavioral health-related needs, as well as assisting those who are most vulnerable with the social drivers of health, and at the same time help with the sustainability of the ECRS. We think this could be a model for other rural EMS units that are struggling financially and with workforce issues.

For the clinic piece of the project, TACH will start with establishing a part-time site at ECRS that is staffed by ECRS Paramedics who are paid by TACH for 12 hours per week. The Paramedics are already in the building waiting for calls, so they would shift to being clinical support staff. If an EMS call comes in, they will leave to do that, and the clinic will close, but patients could still use technology from their homes or vehicles to connect with the TACH provider. This will allow ECRS to continue to meet its mission while also providing access to health care and cutting the ECRS personnel cost significantly. TACH will lease the space from ECRS, providing another source of income for ECRS.

The Community Paramedicine component would entail the ECRS Paramedic and EMT going to identified individuals' homes to assist / evaluate them for medical needs as well as for other issues that could be impacting their health (e.g., food insecurity, water issues, HVAC issues). The team would be connected to TACH through a laptop and, if needed, could connect with a TACH Case Manager who would facilitate reviewing the patient's needs and identifying potential TACH resources. When appropriate, a TACH medical or behavioral health provider could be consulted.

Because Supervisor Fant was a crucial part of this plan coming together, I would like to provide a summary of this project at the December 2023 Board of Supervisor's meeting. A year from now, in December 2024, I would like to return and report on the progress of the collaboration. We are excited about establishing a clinic that will provide medical and behavioral health care to residents of the Elk Creek District, and others who choose to come to that site, as well as initiating a Community Paramedicine program that can help improve the quality and length of life of some of the most medically vulnerable people in the District.

Overview of Collaboration between Tri-Area Community Health and the Elk Creek Rescue Squad

- Federally Qualified Health Center
 - > Provide primary medical and behavioral health care, enabling services (such as transportation and case management), and pharmacy services
 - Must see all people, regardless of the ability to pay
 - Have a sliding scale and a hardship policy
 - Have a Medication Assistance Program for prescriptions

Currently, Seven Sites

- ▶ Grant / Troutdale Clinic opened in January 2021
- ▶ Fries Clinic opened end of March 2023, Pharmacy still being renovated
- Explored placing a site in Elk Creek, but there was no building, and it did not seem sustainable for a full clinic

Emergency Services Collaboration

- Good Relationship with Grayson County Administration and Board of Supervisors
 - Multiple conversations with Supervisor Fant and Emergency Services Coordinator Paul Hoyle over the years about possible ways for Tri-Area to collaborate with Emergency Services to help residents and the sustainability of units across the County
- Supervisor Fant and Administrator Boyer suggested that Tri-Area talk about possibilities with Jamie Carpenter, Chief of the Elk Creek Rescue Squad
 - This led to an "Innovative Programming" grant proposal being submitted to the Virginia State Office of Rural Health
 - The grant was funded for \$20,000 to be used for telehealth equipment to be placed at the Elk Creek Rescue Squad Building
 - We have a goal of helping residents of Grayson County with their medical and behavioral health-related needs, as well as assisting those who are most vulnerable with the social drivers of health, and at the same time helping with the sustainability of the ECRS.
 - ▶ We think this could be a model for other rural EMS units that are struggling financially and h workforce issue

Elk Creek Rescue Squad Collaboration

- Part 1: Telehealth Clinic
 - ▶ Tri-Area will place a telehealth-only clinic in the ECRS building
 - It will be staffed by ECRS Paramedics who will facilitate telehealth connections to Tri-Area medical and behavioral health providers and other Tri-Area staff as needed.
 - Hope to open in January (depending on when the equipment arrives).
 - Will start with Mondays 1-5, Wednesdays 1-5, and Fridays 1-4:30

 - Person will call the Tri-Area Clinic at Fries (888-908-4788) to schedule an appointment, will come to the ECRS building at the scheduled time, and the ECRS Paramedic will help get the person connected with the Tri-Area provider / staff person.
 - If a rescue squad call comes in, the building will close, but those with appointments could still connect from home or the ECRS parking lot, they just would not have the Paramedic on hand.

Elk Creek Rescue Squad Collaboration #2

Part 2: Community Paramedicine

- ECRS Paramedics will go to identified people's homes to assist / evaluate them for medical needs as well as for other issues that could be impacting their health (for example, food insecurity, water issues, HVAC issues).
- Assuming there is adequate service, the CP team may be able to be connected to Tri-Area through a laptop and, if needed, could talk with a Tri-Area Case Manager who would facilitate reviewing the patient's needs and identifying potential Tri-Area resources.
- When appropriate, a TACH medical or behavioral health provider could be consulted.
- This part will start later in the Spring, after the telehealth clinic is running smoothly.

Elk Creek Rescue Squad Collaboration #3

- Part 3: Sustainability
 - Tri-Area will pay for the time the Paramedics are working in the telehealth clinic and when they are on Community Paramedicine calls.
 - The Paramedics already are on site for their shifts, so this will reduce the personnel cost for ECRS, making the unit more financially sustainable.
 - Tri-Area also will lease the space, providing more revenue for ECRS.
 - Tri-Area is looking into the possibility of providing free or reduced rate basic medical and behavioral health services to ECRS staff.
 - We hope that as the program expands, more Paramedics will be needed, and more people will want to work for ECRS because they will be providing care throughout the day and not just when a call comes in.

Elk Creek Rescue Squad Collaboration #4

- We are excited about establishing a clinic that will provide medical and behavioral health care to residents of the Elk Creek District, and others who choose to come to that site.
- We also are excited about beginning a Community Paramedicine program that can help improve the quality and length of life of some of the most medically vulnerable people in the District.
- If this goes well, we can envision trying similar collaborative approaches in other areas across Grayson County.
- We appreciate Supervisor Fant and Administrator Boyer encouraging this collaboration and I thank Chief Carpenter and Paramedic Monica Cornett for their willingness to give it a try.

RESOLUTION OF THE GRAYSON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RESOLUTION TO DECLARE AN INTENT TO REIMBURSE (Public Safety Radio System)

WHEREAS, Grayson County, Virginia (the "County"), is a political subdivision duly created and validly existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that it is essential to finance all or any portion of the costs to (a) acquire, construct, reconstruct, expand, and equip a public safety radio communications system and grants related to increasing availability of public safety communications in the County, and other uses, and (b) pay costs of issuance in connection with any related financing(s) (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County reasonably anticipates to obtain long-term financing for all or any portion of the costs of the Project through the County's participation in the pooled bond program offered from time to time by Virginia Resources Authority ("VRA") or tax-exempt financing(s) from any other lender, as may be necessary or convenient, in one or more financings (the "Obligations"), and accordingly, the County shall comply with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, so that interest on any bonds or notes issued by the County, or VRA on behalf of the County, proceeds of which are used to fund a loan to the County, will remain excludible from gross income for federal income tax purposes in accordance with law; and

WHEREAS, the County now desires to declare its intent to use all or any portion of the proceeds of one or more Obligations to be issued, in one or more series, to reimburse certain expenditures in connection with the Project, among other things, all as required by federal tax laws, including Treasury Regulations § 1.150-2 in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, all as further described below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY, as follows:

1. The Board of Supervisors of the County (the "Board") hereby declares its intent and reasonable expectations for the County to reimburse itself for costs and expenses relating to the Project with a portion of the proceeds of one or more Obligations. Accordingly, this Resolution shall constitute a declaration of "official intent" under Treasury Regulations § 1.150-2, and the County may be reimbursed, if and when any Obligations shall be issued by the County, to the extent permitted by law.

2. It is to be understood that such prior expenditures by the County in connection with the Project may constitute capital expenditures (or would do so with a proper election under general federal income tax principles) or will otherwise comply with the requirements of Treasury Regulations § 1.150-2(d)(3).

3. The County has paid or caused to be paid, beginning no earlier than sixty (60) days prior to adoption and effective date hereof, and will pay or cause to be paid, on and after such effective date hereof, certain expenditures (the "Expenditures") in connection with the Project. Further, it has been determined that those moneys previously advanced no earlier than sixty (60) days prior to the date hereof and to be advanced on and after the date hereof to pay the Expenditures related to the Project are available only for a temporary period and it is necessary to reimburse the County for the Expenditures from the proceeds of one or more issues of Obligations. Accordingly, the Board hereby declares its intent to reimburse the County with the proceeds of the Obligations for the Expenditures with respect to the Project made no earlier than sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of this Resolution. The County reasonably expects on the date hereof that it will reimburse the Expenditures with the proceeds of the Obligations.

4. The County will make, or cause to be made, a reimbursement allocation, which is a written allocation that evidences the use of proceeds thereof to reimburse the Expenditures, no later than eighteen (18) months after the later of the date on which each Expenditure is paid or the Project is placed in service or abandoned, but in no event more than three years after the date on which each Expenditure is paid. This declaration of intent to reimburse, as required by federal tax laws, shall take effect immediately.

5. The maximum principal amount of Obligations expected to be issued or incurred by the County for the funding of the Project is reasonably anticipated to be approximately \$4,000,000.

6. It is to be understood that no Obligations shall be issued, sold, or awarded by the County unless and until the Board adopts an appropriate authorizing resolution and takes all other such further acts as may be required by law, in order for the County to issue any Obligations in connection with the Project.

Blighted properties (non-occupiable) that require demolition are not acceptable properties under the ARS program.

Should the Grayson County Board of Supervisors/Grayson County EDA encounter an occupied structure and continue with the acquisition, the following certification will be upheld.

The Grayson County Board of Supervisors/Grayson County EDA will provide permanent relocation assistance to each LMI household displaced with leveraged funding sources. Up to Forty- Two (42) Months of Housing Assistance Payments shall be provided as outlined in Section 104 (d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, or the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended. DHCD written approval will be required in advance for any properties that will necessitate relocation assistance.

- Provide all program beneficiaries with a copy of DHCD's fair housing brochures;
- Distribute copies of the fair housing brochures at local public events;
- Enlist the participation of local realtors, lenders and homebuilders in an agreement, and promotion of affirmative marketing, open housing and review of underwriting /credit criteria, etc. Publish such agreements in a local paper;
- Conduct public educational programs for local housing consumers, providers, and/or financial institutions, regarding fair housing issues;
- Develop a public information program using local newspapers, radio stations, bulletin board, churches, utility bill mailings, or local government TV channels to ensure that all segments of the community are aware of fair housing requirements, especially realtors, landlords, financial institutions, and the minority community;
- Sponsor a fair housing poster contest at local schools in conjunction with an informational session;
- Develop a fair housing assistance program to make housing opportunities available in non-minority areas, monitor compliance and submit discrimination complaints to the State or Federal government;
- Conduct a formal Assessment of Impediments (AI) study of local zoning, real estate and/or financing practices which affect housing choices of minorities and other protected classes; and
- Survey the special housing problems of minorities and women, determining any effects of discrimination and developing a plan to assist them in overcoming these effects.
- The fair housing activity selected by Grayson County/Grayson County EDA will be a different one each program year. Furthermore, all fair housing activities will be properly documented so their completion can be verified.
- If Grayson County/Grayson County EDA has more than one active DHCD project, only one fair housing activity may be conducted. All project files will be documented accordingly.




GRANT COMPUTER CENTER QUARTERLY PROGRESS REPORT

2nd QUARTER – Fiscal Year 2024 (October – November - December 2023) "Connecting our world through generosity"

The computer center was open for public use for an average of 20.02 hours per week for 13 weeks. There were four (4) closings for holidays, one (1) for bees in building, and thirteen (13) due to pandemic staffing shortage.

During the quarter, the Grant Computer Center averaged 15.69 users per week and a total of 204 users for the quarter. There were countless users who utilize our Wi-Fi. There are six (6) regular and two (2) alternate volunteers who worked 262 hours.



Since last report, the following changes and/or improvements have been accomplished:

- We are open Monday from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm and Tuesday through Thursday from 11:00 am to 5:00 pm and continue our efforts to recruit additional volunteers to expand operating hours. We are looking at possibly a Friday shift from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm and/or opening the computer center during Bingo from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm on Fridays.
- We are currently referring Homebound Schooling Program students to the Gate Center as we do not have an instructor available at this time.
- The Goodwill Grange is improving its emergency preparedness plan in light of past events. We are in the process of formulating a quick reference manual to provide instruction for different types of situations such as tornados, victims of abuse, gun violence/threat, homelessness, etc. We will continue to provide emergency shelter and water and obtain assistance or take other measures, as appropriate, as directed in the manual.
- We are providing a venue for meetings and sign-up events for the Affordable Connectivity Program for Gigabeam, the Oregon Institute for a Better Way, and the National Grange.
- We are working to provide individual assistance to people signing up for internet service and helping with the operation of their devices.
- We have updated all computers with the latest antivirus software.
- We are working with Wytheville Community College to allow internships at our facility as we have completed the proper documentation.

The following changes and/or improvements are planned for the future:

- We have completed upgrading the drive and parking area by resurfacing with chip and tar paving. Funds were specifically designated for his project.
- Will continue to replace office furniture as necessary when funds permit.
- Will continue to maintain supplies for operations (i.e., print cartridges, alcohol gel, paper, etc.).
- Will continue to perform maintenance and upkeep on the computer center, such as repainting, replacing ceiling tiles, replacing air filters, painting, and making repairs to the roof. Painting will be scheduled as soon as possible.

Continuing Community Support:

- We now have Gigabeam internet service which is faster than our previous service.
- Device and computer class/training is offered each Thursday from 2 to 5 pm.
- We continue to welcome many citizens to gain a working knowledge of computers and the internet as well as provide a needed service to users, such as email, faxing, copying/printing, transferring media, and retrieving passwords.
- We are pledged to offer our facility as a backup evacuation area for emergency situations at the Grayson Highlands School or the community as needs arise. We offer adequate bathroom facilities, a lending library, and use of our internet service. The Grange maintains a supply of bottled water in the event the local schools (or citizens) need to utilize our facility for shelter.
- We have been working with the Grayson High School principal to assist in testing the school's communications capabilities and in their assessing our grounds and facility as a possible evacuation site.
- Rugby Fire and Rescue has utilized our conference room, computers, television screen, and internet for their monthly recertification training. They are in need of EMTs and we have assisted in this effort by advertising when and where training sessions begin.
- We will continue to support Troutdale Fire and Rescue by donating computers and providing training on computer use and technical support. We will extend this to Rugby Fire and Rescue as internet becomes available in their area.
- We have partnered with Grayson Connected for improved internet service in our area and are getting more questions lately about the operations of digital equipment. We are there to help people with their question and we enjoy being a part of this endeavor. Many people are being directed to Gigabeam.com or the Grayson County website to sign up for service.
- We will continue to update the community on the progress of the Grayson Connected Project.
- We continue to support individuals helping out while obtaining their community service hours for their court hearings. They help by weed-eating, cleaning, and various other tasks.
- The Grange offers a place for residents of this area to get internet. There is limited cell service and radio in the area, so the only reliable resource for media is our facility. It appears US Cellular has gained popularity in the area as it is the only cell provider who offers home internet service if you can receive their signal.
- WiFi continues to be available in the vicinity of the building and parking lot.

All Grant Computer Center business is conducted at the monthly Goodwill Grange meeting and/or through the Executive Committee as necessary. The Goodwill Grange meets every third Thursday at 7:00 p.m. The public is welcome.


